You can have fun flying out your kite with your friends. You can make your own kite as it is a very simple thing to do

1:19:04 – 01:37:20

What is needed to make a kite?

Plain paper.....reed sticks.....some thread.....a marker for beautifying your kite.....

Tape.....scissors and nylon paper for the kite’s tails

01:37:20 – 01:49:00

You can make your kite in any shape you wish. First, draw a beautiful picture as desired on the paper.

01:49:00 – 2:10:18

Then a small hole is made in the centre of the paper. The thread is pulled through to the other side and tied round the reed stick. The string is what will help fly the kite when it is completed.

2:10:18 – 2:44:01

The tape is placed along the stick to give the paper the firmness. Two reed sticks are bent and placed at the ends of the paper.

Then nylon strands are cut out, this is to serve as tails for the kite, which are fixed at the edges of the kite.

3:17:05 – 3:29:02

Curved pieces of bone with drawings made on them, paper clips, amber marbles of various colours, and pliers for cutting the wire.

3:29:02 – 3:57:22

The craftsman cuts up the wire to a desired size. He then sorts out the items to be used to make them combinations.

After marbles, bones and small round metal pieces, he makes a hook twisting it with pliers. This is for holding the ring that will hold the keys.
